

Helpful choices bingo

GRADES K-5 / CLASSROOM DISCUSSION

An adult reads a prompt from the guide. Find a matching choice and mark it. Discuss the choice together. No racing, dares or real-world searches.

Walk calmly	Ask a trusted adult	Put toys away	Listen to directions
Keep paths clear	Speak kindly	Ask before touching	Notice a change
Wait your turn	Report a spill	Help by telling	Use your own space
Ask a question	Follow class rules	Stop and think	Thank a helper

Try a row of four, then explain one choice. Everyone can join the discussion, even without completing a row.

Bingo leader guide

FOR TEACHERS AND FAMILIES

Read prompts in any order. Accept sensible explanations. The goal is a useful conversation, not a test or a competition.

The hallway is busy. What helps everyone move comfortably? (Walk calmly)

You see something unfamiliar. Who can help? (Ask a trusted adult)

The game is finished. What helps keep the room tidy? (Put toys away)

The teacher explains the next activity. What helps? (Listen to directions)

A backpack is in the walking space. What matters? (Keep paths clear; tell the adult if needed)

A classmate needs time to answer. What can you do? (Speak kindly or wait your turn)

A cup spills. What is a helpful first response? (Report a spill; do not inspect or clean an unknown substance)

You are unsure about an instruction. What can you do? (Ask a question)

Something looks different from the usual routine. What helps? (Stop and think; ask a trusted adult)

An adult helps with a concern. What can you say? (Thank a helper)
