

Fall Protection Fundamentals - Answer Key

29 CFR 1926.503 / applicable walking-working surface rules

1. Fall protection should be selected based on:
A - The actual hazard, task and applicable standard
2. Travel restraint is intended to:
A - Keep a worker from reaching the fall edge
3. Personal fall arrest requires attention to:
A - Anchorage, connectors, harness, clearance and rescue
4. A worker should anchor to:
A - An approved anchorage/system for the task
5. Fall-protection equipment should be inspected:
A - Before use and as required by the employer/manufacture
6. Damaged or impact-loaded equipment should be:
A - Removed from service and handled per program/manufacture
7. A rescue plan matters because:
A - Suspended workers may need prompt rescue after a fall
8. Standing on guardrails is:
A - Unsafe and not an acceptable way to gain height
9. Employees exposed to fall hazards should be trained to:
A - Recognize hazards and use the required procedures/systems
10. This course replaces site-specific fall-protection instruction.
